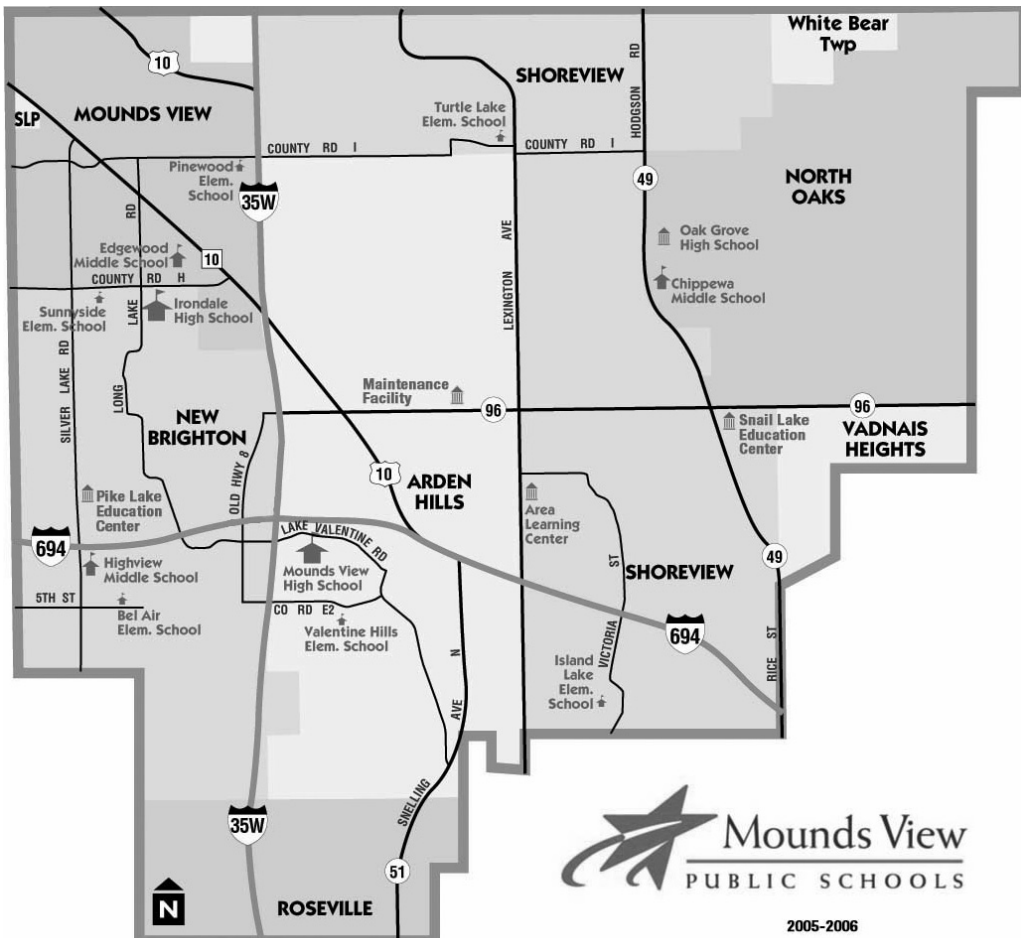
## SCHOOL BOARD

A seven-member School Board establishes District policies, approves an annual budget and works with the administration to determine the District's educational goals. All meetings are broadcast live and replayed regularly on Cable Channel 20.

### TRANSPORTATION

Mounds View provides bus service for students in accordance with state law that requires districts to provide free transportation to all students living two miles or more from their school. In addition, the District offers fee-based bus service within two miles, to accommodate parents' requests for transportation assistance. **651-639-6200.**



### NUTRITION SERVICES

Mounds View teaches healthy eating habits by introducing students to a wide variety of food choices. Students in all schools can enjoy breakfast and lunch daily. All menus meet nutrition requirements established by the USDA. Families may apply to receive free or reduced-price meals based on need. **651-639-6011.**

### BEFORE- and AFTER-SCHOOL CARE

Each elementary school offers fee-based before- and after-school care programs for students in kindergarten–fifth grade. The programs provide learning opportunities and enrichment activities year-round, with a full-day program available in the summer. In addition, students can participate in Elementary Targeted Services programs that offer a variety of after-school academic enrichment offerings. **651-482-8203.**

### ALTERNATIVE LEARNING

A variety of alternative programs are available for students who benefit from non-traditional learning strategies.

- **Area Learning Center:** for high school students working to meet their graduation requirements. **651-482-8203.**

- **Career and Life Transition Program:** a special education program serving students ages 18–21 with a variety of special needs. **651-639-6266.**

### Student Support

The District provides state-mandated services from birth to age 21 as well as in-school support services for school-age students. Services include: Title I, English Language Learning, Indian Education, developmental adapted physical education, speech and language services, psychological services, occupational/physical therapy, school health services, social work services, chemical health services and emotional-behavior disorder education. **651-639-6013.**

### SUMMER SCHOOL

The District offers a variety of summer learning opportunities for students in grades 2–12. Basic academic skill classes are offered to students who can benefit from additional academic support. This program accepts students based on teacher recommendations. A summer academic enrichment program is available to students in grades 2–8.
