THE CHIPPEWA EXPERIENCE

An attention to individual learning characterizes the Chippewa Middle School experience. Within each grade level, students are guided by staff as they learn, grow and use their skills to become independent learners and thinkers. Parents and community members are also involved with the school by donating time and materials while supporting students. All of this individualized attention produces positive results. Chippewa students earn exceptional test scores, are motivated towards academic achievement and participate in a high number of co-curricular activities. Chippewa offers students a healthy learning environment as well. Recent facilities upgrades include a new gymnasium, new and renovated classrooms and a new air handling system throughout the building.

PERSONALIZED INSTRUCTION

Chippewa teachers organize classes into smaller sizes during parts of each day to personalize instruction and tap each student's full potential in a one-on-one work environment. A comprehensive online database of students' test scores and achievement data is readily available and easily accessible to teachers to ensure that all students are working to their full potential. Access to this timely information also helps teachers tailor their daily instructional approach to match students' needs and meet personalized performance goals.

RESPECTFUL BEHAVIOR

Chippewa offers every student a healthy, safe and respectful learning environment in which students are treated fairly and with respect by teachers and other students. An active school committee has established a code of conduct that requires respectful behavior from every student both inside and outside the classroom.



PARENT PARTNERSHIPS

Parents are encouraged to play an active role in their child's school experience. Chippewa offers many opportunities for parents to support learning. Parent-School Partnerships are coordinated primarily by CHAC—The Chippewa Advisory Council. This parent-led organization manages fundraisers, volunteer opportunities, school socials and various other activities.

STRONG PARENT CONNECTIONS

Chippewa offers parents a way to electronically access records of their student's grades, assignments, schedule and attendance. Parents consider this Internet-based option an effective home-to-school communication tool.

HOW TO ENROLL

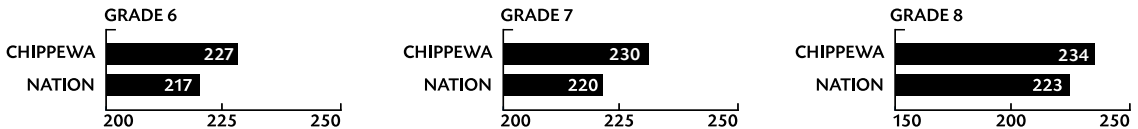

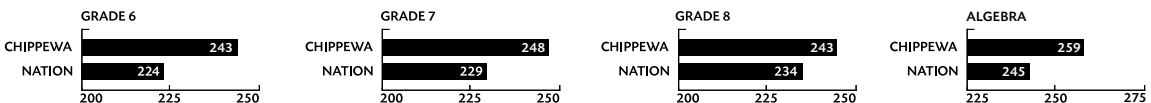
