



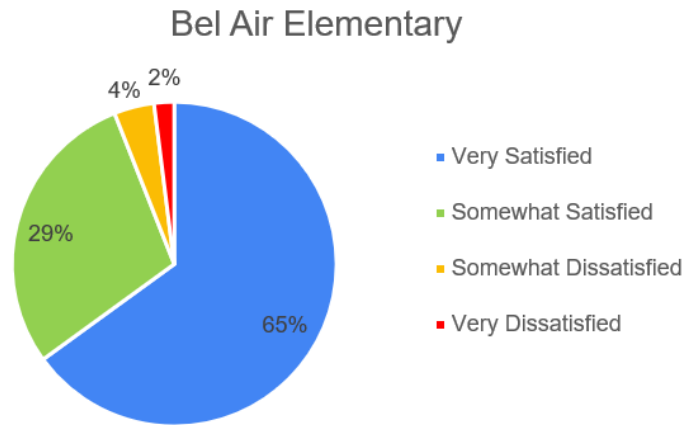
Bel Air Elementary Fall learning model family survey results

We recently invited parents to provide feedback on the learning model(s) they participated in this fall/winter. Here's what we learned from those who participated in the survey.

- **Most families are satisfied that Bel Air is doing its best to serve all students and families.**

Of the 333 families that responded,

- 65% were very satisfied
- 29% were somewhat satisfied
- 4% were somewhat dissatisfied
- 2% were very dissatisfied



Families responded to the survey based on the learning model their student participated in:

Feedback from families who participated in blended learning this fall:

- 94% of Bel Air families were satisfied with the blended learning model.
- 89% of the families thought Bel Air had the right amount of safety measures to keep students and staff healthy.
- 99% of the Bel Air families thought the safety measures were easy for their child to follow.
