



Chippewa Middle School Fall learning model family survey results

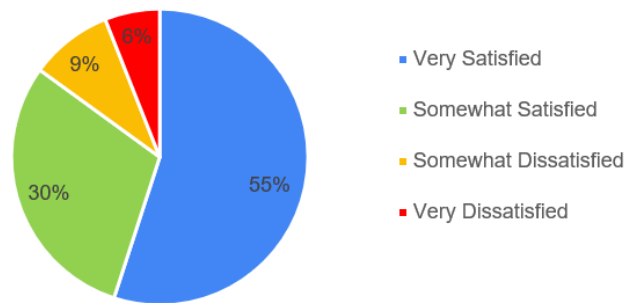
We recently invited parents to provide feedback on the learning model(s) they participated in this fall/winter. Here's what we learned from those who participated in the survey.

- **Most families are satisfied that Chippewa is doing its best to serve all students and families.**

Of the 374 families that responded,

- 55% were very satisfied
- 30% were somewhat satisfied
- 9% were somewhat dissatisfied
- 6% were very dissatisfied

Feedback from families who participated in blended learning this fall:

- 77% of Chippewa families were satisfied with the blended learning model.
- 83% of the families thought Chippewa had the right amount of safety measures to keep students and staff healthy.
- 91% of the Chippewa families thought the safety measures were easy for their student to follow.
