

SKI & SNOWBOARD PROGRAM

CHAPERONE RESPONSIBILITIES

As a chaperone of the students in the After-School Ski and Snowboard program, you are responsible for the supervision of students participating in the program. This includes while being transported to and from the ski area and while at the ski area or chalet.

1. Please arrive at your assigned school **before** the students load the buses at 2:30pm (middle school) 3:15 (high school). Be sure to check in with your school's coordinator in the front lobby (or designated area) each week when you arrive. For the return trip, be ready to load the buses by 8:15pm to return to school. Buses will leave Wild Mtn promptly at 8:30pm. Masks must be worn on the bus; no eating while on the bus.
2. For liability reasons, students are required to ride their assigned bus. Please take attendance as students board buses to leave school **and** as they board buses to leave the ski area. This will ensure that only registered students get on the bus, and that the same kids who rode the bus from school are on the bus to return to school.
3. One chaperone from each bus will **call Wild Mountain 651-465-6365** and report how many lift tickets are needed (Report total number of student lift tickets needed and total number of chaperone tickets needed). When the bus arrives, send in one chaperone to get the lift tickets.
4. All students will be required to pass a test the first day of the program. Students who do not pass this test will take lessons immediately. Any and all students (and chaperones) are welcome to take lessons throughout the season.
5. Report any attendance discrepancies and/or any other problem to your school's coordinator.
6. There will be a lead chaperone present both evenings. Make sure to notify **Dan Symonik (Mondays)** or **Matt Holz (Tuesdays)** of any incidents or injuries. If you need to contact Dan or Matt please ask a Wild employee to call them on a walkie-talkie. Be sure an injury/incident report is filled out for even the most minor injury or incident. Jeannie or Matt will determine if a parent should be called.
7. Wild has reserved the Bear Den for our program. Students can keep their belongings in the Den, although the area will be unsupervised. Please encourage students to keep valuables either with them or in a locker.
8. Please use and encourage students to use the ski corral. This is included in the price of our lift tickets and will help ensure that all equipment is safe.
9. After returning to school, do a final walk through of the bus. Make sure all items have been taken. **Please do not leave until all students have been picked up.** Report any extreme tardiness of parents to the coordinator.
10. There will be a meeting for all chaperones at 5 pm on the first night of each program (December 20 & 21). Please be sure to attend!
