1. Injuries/Accidents

Debbie Crampton was unable to attend meeting so we did not have reports for injuries that have occurred since our last meeting.

2. Lead in Water Updates

MDH has distributed the Lead in School Drinking Water Legislation 2017. School districts are now required to sample for lead in water every 5 years beginning July 1, 2018. The district has already been sampling every five years so this is not a change. The district must adopt the commissioner's model plan for lead in water or develop and adopt an alternative plan which must be approved by the school board before July 1, 2018. The new legislation also requires leased sites to be tested by the school district. The district has not sampled at REACH Academy, CLT Roseville, CLT Shoreview or the new District Center. These buildings will be tested during the 2018-2019 school year. Other buildings are up to date and will not require sampling again until the 2020-2021 school year. The District must decide what Action Level they wish to comply with and this must be stated in the Lead in Water Management Plan. Options are to stay with the EPA guideline of 20 parts per billion (ppb), the Public Works requirement of 15 ppb or go with the MDH guideline of 2 ppb. Whichever Action Level the district decides to go with, they must be prepared for it to be scrutinized by staff and parents.

3. Status of Bleacher Repairs

Bleacher repairs are currently in progress. The district will notify IEA and send photos when items requiring repair for compliance are completed so they can be certified.

4. BBP Exposure Procedures

Since the district now uses a Triage system for injuries, Kathy is wondering if the BBP exposure packet is still necessary. Kathy to find out how these injuries are treated during Triage and if there is a different set of or additional questions asked when there is a potential exposure to another person's blood. There should be information gathered regarding the source individual in case the district wants to request a blood sample from that individual. It was decided that the BBP exposure packet is most likely not needed.

5. New Business or Concerns

Angela stated that the temperature of the eyewash water in the kitchen at Irondale HS may be too hot. The correct temperature is to be tepid which is 60-100 degrees Fahrenheit.
