HOW CAN OUR FAMILIES PARTICIPATE IN AND SUPPORT

Tiger Pride

How can our Bel Air Community, staff and parents, work together to prepare students for success beyond the Mounds View Public School System?

Why is the "end in view" approach so important?

We are creating and educating our future! Our students will be leaders within our community. Bel Air staff value the teaching and learning of our future leaders. (community contributors)

How will we achieve greatness?

Partnerships! By partnering with all community members to provide a "whole child" approach to education! Bel Air staff believe that all students want to learn and want to make good choices—we will teach students multiple ways to approach challenges to achieve peace and compromise.

What is my role in communication and collaboration?

Students achieve them most when they feel that the adults in their lives care about them and are communicating similar messages. We have several conference opportunities throughout the year and request your presence as often as possible to provide a strong team and consistent message to your child.

Who needs to be involved?

WE NEED YOU!!! As a parent, you are your child's greatest support and strongest advocate! We stand beside you to ensure that every child has access to a quality foundation in their education.

How are we going to monitor progress?

Staff meet regularly to identify student progress and develop goals, strategies and opportunities to enhance and strengthen foundations in their academics. We will share their progress with you throughout the year.

Responsive Classroom practices are used to create students that are

<u>Respectful, Responsible</u> and <u>Ready to Learn</u>.

Common Vocabulary:

Morning Meeting: A morning meeting has been established as part of the instructional day in each classroom. It's a time when the classroom builds a sense of community and establishes respected for each other. At the meeting, students get an opportunity to greet each other and partake in community building activities.

ABC Staff Meetings: The entire staff meets weekly in extended grade level teams to discuss academic, student behavior needs and collaboration topics. The teams of educators and support staff offer thought and strategies to assist students in owning their education.

<u>Take a Break:</u> Students or teachers may initiate "Take a Break" as a first step of reflection. A short break is taken by the student, in the classroom. This allows students to "reset" their behavior and return to the group with minimal disruption and increased self-control.

<u>Buddy Room:</u> This is a pre-determined classroom for a student to go to when "Take a Break" has not been effective in the students own classroom. This time allows the student an opportunity to regain self-control in a new environment. After a short time, the student is invited back to class.

<u>Fix it Plan:</u> When a student has been disrespectful to people or property, the student will work with staff to create an action plan to fix the problem.

<u>Logical Consequences:</u> A child may need to "fix" a poor choice that was made during the school day. A plan of action is designed with the student that relates the consequence to the incident.

<u>Problem Solving Conference:</u> This is a private, teacher guided conversation with a student. The purpose is to allow the student the opportunity to identify the problem and work with the teacher to resolve it.

<u>Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports (PBIS):</u> PBIS/Tiger Pride is a framework of school wide expectations and systems to support positive school climate and interventions for all students, staff, and families.

Bel Air Tiger Pride

Bel Air staff have put a lot of thought and energy into Positive Student Recognition Programs! Here is a list of some of the ways that students can be recognized at Bel Air.

Tiger Pride Slips

When a student has demonstrated above and beyond Tiger Pride behavior, they can be awarded a Tiger Pride Slip! All staff has the ability to recognize and give out a Tiger Pride Slip. These slips are collected in grade level boxes in the IMC/library for weekly recognition.

Two Tiger Pride slips from each grade level are recognized weekly! These students choose from a menu of student and staff generated activities that demonstrates how much we appreciate their Tiger Pride in making our school a great place to learn! (ex. Bel Air T-Shirt/scarf, lunch with Principal/staff, special chair for the day)

Classroom Lunch Program

Lunchroom staff acknowledges positive behavior by placing green, yellow, and red cups on the classroom lunch tables. This is the challenge...classroom students must work together, as a team to keep their green cup throughout the lunch period. When they do, that class earns a sticker for that day! The classroom with the most "green day" stickers, earns the 'Golden Plate Award' and are first in line for lunch that Friday.

The classroom with the most green stickers every 2 weeks earns 'Fancy Lunch Friday' with a tablecloth, table decorations, special guests, games, and/or music. WHAT A GREAT WAY TO CELEBRATE TEAMWORK AND CREATING A POSITIVE LUNCHROOM CLIMATE!!!
